industry, launched its Innovation Awards 2007 today, Thursday 23rd November 2006.

interests in relation to home building. The deadline for entries is 31<sup>st</sup> January. Winners

will be announced on 11th May 2007 at the association's Annual Lunch, which will be

attended by 650 members of the Scottish homebuilding industry.
