HOME BUILDERS WELCOME NEW PLANNING POLICY

Homes for Scotland, the organisation representing the country's home building industry, has welcomed the publication of draft Scottish Planning Policy 3: Planning for Housing.

Planning Manager Blair Melville, a member of the steering group set up by the Scottish

Government to develop the Policy, said:

"As the Communities Minister has stated, despite rising demand for new homes in Scotland there has been no corresponding increase in building. This has largely been

due to the lack of land being made available for housing and inefficiencies in the

planning system.

We therefore welcome the thinking behind the new policy which seeks to align itself with

the objectives of the new Planning Act by providing clear advice to local authorities to

ensure significantly greater allocation of land for housing. We look forward to working

with the Government to achieve, and exceed where possible, its target of increasing the

number of new homes built in Scotland to 35,000 by the middle of the next decade so

that everyone who wants to own their own home has the choice and ability to do so."
