Who we are:

Homes for Scotland (HFS) provides a strong and unified voice for our members, demonstrating the benefits that home building across all tenures delivers for our country. With a wide-ranging membership spanning smaller developers and Registered Social Landlords to larger home building companies and PLCs, we represent the breadth and depth of the whole sector. This includes associated companies which provide a crucial function in the wider housing delivery process, such as mortgage brokers, lawyers, architects, planning consultants and suppliers.

Delivering the vast majority of all new homes that are built, this rich and varied membership enables us to make an unequivocal case for an increase in housing supply, speaking with the authority and expertise that befits our common purpose: to enable our members to deliver new high-quality, affordable, energyefficient homes that meet the housing needs and aspirations of all those who live, or wish to live in, Scotland.

GOAL:

How it will be delivered:



Create stakeholder — mapping engagement strategies to manage and evaluate relationships and partnerships which influence our sector We will develop a comprehensive stakeholder mapping and engagement strategy. In addition, we will evidence for our members where we have moved the dial on sentiment and influence with relevant stakeholders and partners.



Design a public campaign plan that supports the building of new homes underpinned by data on key opinion former perceptions Through a partnership funding approach we will develop and deliver research on perceptions and create a civic and business campaign to move the dial on the understanding and knowledge of home building.

Create strategic, contextual and targeted programme of communications for members and stakeholders A portfolio of quality, regular and insightful member and stakeholder communications including weekly and monthly newsletters, briefings for local/national politicians, events and planned proactive media activity.

We will also utilise digital tools to strengthen direct engagement between members and politicians. Media (broadcast, print and social) will be quantified and show broadening of coverage.



Exploit external platforms for HFS and our members to position issues and messaging We will develop a speaker and panel engagement plan, creating opportunities for the HFS senior team or wider membership as appropriate.

Planning evidence:

An improved evidence base to strengthen our engagement and position with local and national planning stakeholders We will work with the Scottish Government, local authorities and members to create data sets relevant to planning performance and housing need and demand.



National Planning — Framework 4 (NPF4):

Effective implementation of NPF4 and supporting members through transition. We will work with the Scottish Government, local authorities and other stakeholders to promote that any changes in the approach to planning for housing (eg the use of minimum housing land targets) are implemented appropriately to reduce the risk of delivery delays arising from complication, conflict and misunderstandings on policy.

Local Development Plans (LDPs):

Influencing local authorities to ensure that LDPs are deliveryfocused with a long-term supply of deliverable land and policies that work in practice We will influence, and respond to, new processes for LDP preparation, particularly the evidence report and gatecheck, with the aim of making a positive change in the way emerging plans are prepared, scrutinised and amended prior to adoption.



Supply of Land and Homes:

The method of monitoring and measuring the housing land requirement pipeline in each part of Scotland is robust and focused on achieving the delivery of homes on the ground, not just identifying land on paper We will work with the Scottish Government and local authorities to achieve more consistent and ambitious approaches to scrutinising and reviewing the deliverable housing land supply through housing land audits and the housing land requirement pipelines emerging through 'new style' local development plan processes.

Create a clear roadmap – to net zero to support the Scottish Government's commitment to net zero We will work with members and the Scottish Government to deliver collaboration on a resourced plan to get to net zero in timescales that are commercially realistic and implementable by the many stakeholders involved in the transition through the creation of a Future Homes Hub.



A utilities sector supportive of housing delivery, housing growth and collective efforts to meet net zero targets We will work collaboratively with utility providers to ensure that the requirements to support the net zero transition are clearly articulated and understood.

A clear and simple model for — delivering infrastructure

We will identify new infrastructure requirements to support housing and new communities, ensuring these are costed and achievable while maintaining the delivery of homes.

We will identify and shape new models and sources of finance for infrastructure required to support new developments and communities.



Improved mortgage market-led support for home ownership We will work with others to develop initiatives and strategies to assist greater numbers of potential home buyers to access mortgages and the new homes market, allowing sustainable higher loan-to-value lending and reducing the requirement for public subsidy support in the long term.

Communications and risk management on key issues significantly impacting the sector We will utilise the internal protocols we have in place for crisis management and the rebuttal of false reporting.

Create messaging and collateral on sector issues and insights for members to use in stakeholder engagement We will create and maintain contextual easyto-use collateral (templates, presentations, documents, data etc) that facilitate and expand the clear and consistent articulation of our core messages by members and which are easily accessible through our member hub.

Other consenting practice is characterised by a can-do attitude based on local authorities and statutory agencies being better resourced and better informed on the benefits of home building to their area / remit We will work positively with local authorities and statutory agencies, equipping them with the information they need to put deliverable policies and processes in place and aligning our messaging to the Scottish Government where barriers to sustainable delivery can't be resolved at the local level



Develop with the — Scottish Government building standards that support our members and their customers We will work positively with Building Standards Division and Local Authority Building Standards Scotland throughout the development of Building Standards Futures Board Delivery Model Workstreams to ensure that changes to the building standards verification model reflect industry ("customer/end user") needs for a process and service that supports the sustainable delivery of new homes.

How it will be delivered:

We will work with utility providers to improve the customer/supplier relationship and development processes.



Making our contribution – to addressing the climate emergency We will demonstrate the continued improvement in the energy efficiency of new homes. We will support home builders to play their part in continuing to address the climate emergency. We will highlight and work to address the systemic challenges that need to be overcome to allow lower carbon homes to be built – this includes working with Distribution Network Operators, challenging skills and supply chain constraints and influencing consumer choices.
