

Background All new homes will have to be constructed to nearly zero carbon standards by 2020 in line with European legislation¹. Since 2007, the home building industry has reduced emissions by around 75% compared to 1990 levels through progressive tightening of building standards (Section 6: Energy)2. Further changes to building standards in October 2015 mean that the home building industry is one step closer to the challenge of delivering zero carbon housing solutions, at scale, across Scotland. **Competition Invite** With 2016 being the year of Architecture, Design and Innovation, Homes for Scotland invites submissions from students for innovative designs of a concept family house type, suitable to meet future zero carbon requirements set to be introduced in Scotland by 2020. Students are encouraged to think creatively, whilst ensuring their submissions are buildable, replicable at scale and meet future customer demands and expectations. **Competition Format** Entries will be judged by a panel of architecture and home building industry experts with the best entries from an open stage shortlisted and invited to present their concepts to the panel. The Brief

Students are asked to submit a concept for a nearly zero carbon, three bedroom, detached family home (around 100m²), designed to comply with 2015 Scottish Building Standards. Entries should demonstrate innovative approaches to design and use of materials and space whilst taking full consideration of the commercial aspects of development such as practicality of construction, how replicable the design is across a range of sites and locations and how it meets customer demands and expectations.

Submissions should include the following:

- Site plan, floor plan(s), sections and elevations
- 3D visualisation of the concept
- Outline specification and backstop u-values for wall types, floors, roofs and openings
- A selection of core details that demonstrate the principles of the 'fabric first' strategies employed within the building design
- Evidence to demonstrate the principles of appropriate heating and ventilation strategies
- A Design Statement (max 1000 words) outlining how the design meets the set criteria

Site Information

Entrants will be provided with the site details of BRE Innovation Park @Ravenscraig. House types should be designed specifically for one of the four vacant plots and consideration given to the merits of plot selection.



Prizes All finalists will be invited to attend the Homes for Scotland Annual Lunch & Awards at the EICC in Edinburgh on 20 May 2016—the premier event in the home building industry calendar attracting some 900 senior industry representatives last year, where the winner will be announced and finalists presented with their awards. The competition is open to all current students³ studying built environment-related undergraduate degrees in Scotland. Both individual and team entries are encouraged (to a maximum of three team members)⁴.
